




- Ambassador Dr. Clovis Maksoud, Professor of International Relations and Director of the Center for the Global South, American University, Washington, D.C.

Simon Shaheen

Simon Shaheen is one of the most significant Arab musicians, performers, and composers of his generation. A Palestinian, born in the village of Tarshiha in the Galilee, Shaheen's childhood was steeped in music. His soaring technique, melodic ingenuity, and unparalleled grace have earned him international acclaim as a virtuoso on the 'oud and violin. This unique contribution to the world of arts was recognized in 1994 when Shaheen was honored with the prestigious National Heritage Award at the White House. In 1982, Shaheen formed the Near Eastern Music Ensemble in New York. This time also marked the beginning of Shaheen's workshops and lecture/demonstrations in schools, colleges, and universities to educate the younger generation.



Nawar Shora, Esq.

Nawar Shora is the Legal Director and Director of Diversity Education and Law Enforcement Outreach at the American-Arab Anti-Discrimination Committee (ADC). He is also the author of the recently published *Arab American Handbook*, an easy-to-read, introductory guide to the Arab, Arab-American, and Muslim cultures. Nawar has delivered in-person trainings to more than 20,000 professionals, including law enforcement, university, and corporate groups. Additionally, he has reached hundreds of thousands of others through two federal government training videos about Arabs and Muslims where he served as a subject matter expert. He is one of four founding community members of the FBI's AMSAC (Arab, Muslim, Sikh Advisory Council).



Warren David

Warren David, a third-generation Arab American of Lebanese and Syrian heritage, has been a leader and activist in the Detroit Arab American community for more than 25 years. He was the creator and executive producer of "Arabesque: Insights into Arab Culture," the award-winning program which aired on WDET-FM and was distributed via satellite to more than 50 National Public Radio affiliates. A dedicated curator of Arab culture, Mr. David has invested his time and personal resources to document and tell the story of the Arab American experience. He is the Founder and Publisher of Arab Detroit, which is dedicated to disseminating an accurate image about the Arab American community, and the President and CEO of David Communications, a multi-cultural communications and public relations firm which specializes in the Arab market.



Siham Awada Jaafar

Co-Producer of *Images and Perceptions of Arab Americans* workshop and host of the "Community Connection" television program, Siham Awada Jaafar is a well respected and established practitioner in both community and media relations. Her passion for community relations coupled with her natural communication skills has made her a skillful and effective communicator.
