MAXINE CAIN, Former Director of Elementary Education, Lansing School District Specialized: Self-Esteem, Team Building, Diversity and Multi-Cultural Education

Former Ann Arbor Police Department Lieutenant; Comedian

An Epic Journey at the Height of the Civil Rights Movement Motown's Legendary Artist, Singer, and Activist



SEAN STONE is an actor, film director, producer, cinematographer and screenwriter. He is the son of producer/Director Oliver Stone. Sean starred in such greats as National Born Killers: Born on the Fourth of July with Tom Cruise, The Doors, Wallstreet , JFK and other acclaimed Hollywood films. He produced, directed and starred in the blockbuster film Greystone Park. He is a member of the Princeton University class of 2006. He is currently working on a healthcare documentary focusing on the religion of Islam. He is a recent convert to Islam and is sought after for his insight on the misconception is Islam in Hollywood, mainstream America and those that perpetrate acts of violence in the name of religion. He has appeared on CNN, The O'Reilly Factor, and FOX for his historic knowledge, his grasp on the political/religious realm that has been the mainstay of media posts, and talk show topics. This has provided him an edge on creating a fact based, intelligent and well focused conversation about the Middle East and the controversy in that part of the world.



JUSTICE RICHARD BERNSTEIN is a justice on the Michigan Supreme Court. Elected to the court on November 4, 2014, he was sworn in on January 1, 2015, for a term expiring on December 31, 2022. He ran on the platform of "Blind Justice". Richard Bernstein is a tireless advocate for disabled rights and providing a voice to those who would otherwise be forced to be silent. Richard is committed to taking action. He successfully partnered with the United States Department of Justice to force the City of Detroit to fix broken wheelchair lifts on its buses. In a landmark settlement against Delta Airlines and Detroit Metro Airport, Richard gained accessibility for disabled fliers and set the precedent for airlines and airports to be covered under the Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990. He fought the State of Michigan and won to preserve special education funding throughout the state.



MARTHA REEVES is passionate about the concept of diversity and has spoken in many arenas regarding her own experience as a black entertainer at Motown and the challenges that she faced and her journey in overcoming those challenges. Her personal accounts have impacted the conversation on diversity and inclusion. Reeves is an American R&B, pop singer, former Detroit politician, and lead singer of the Motown girl group Martha and the Vandellas. During her tenure with The Vandellas, they scored over a dozen hit singles, including "Nowhere to Run", "Jimmy Mack", and their signature "Dancing in the Street". From 2005 until to 2009, Reeves served as an elected council member for the city of Detroit, Michigan. Now in her mid-seventies, Martha continues to perform throughout America and Europe.



AMBASSADOR/DR. CLOVIS MAKSOUD is a former ambassador and permanent observer of the League of Arab States at the United Nations and it's chief representative in the United States for more than 10 years. He is the director of American University's Center for the Global South. He is a lawyer, journalist, and diplomat and served as the League of Arab States, ambassador to India and Southeast Asia as well as serving as a special envoy to the United States in 1974. He serves as Vice Chair of the United Nations Development Program advisory board on the Arab human development reports. He is a professor on the Middle East, Global South issues, international organizations, and preventative diplomacy at both the School of International Service and AU's Washing College of Law. He has also served as a political consultant to many US Presidents and recently published his best selling memoirs.



MICHAEL REYES, Reyes is a Chicano/Mexicano poet, emcee, actor, playwright, artist and community organizer (specializing in youth development). For 12 years, his combination of hip-hop, poetry and spoken word have created a unique blend, where his narratives are infused into a rhythmically crowd pleasing performance. A leading voice in progressive and radical music, Reyes combines cultural stories of resistance, raw hip-hop and inspiring poems, to reach youth and elders alike. His work challenges and confronts the many social ills faced by communities of color.



MAXINE HANKINS CAIN, Ed.D. began her professional career in 1968 as a primary unit teacher with the Detroit Public Schools and has since served in the capacities of educational resource specialist, principal in both Lansing and Detroit, Director of Elementary Education for the Lansing District and Superintendent of Sankofa Shule Public School Academy in Lansing, Michigan Maxine is a national keynote speaker and workshop presenter. She has been invited by many local and national business and educational organizations to speak before youth and adults, sharing her expertise on self-esteem, bullying, diversity and inclusion, empowering employees, and creating effective teams. Participants have made comments such as, "Maxine changed my life! She should take this show on the road!"



COMMANDER DAVID ROBINSON: In 1992, David Robinson was selected as Dearborn's first Community Policing office and created community based initiatives that are still in practice today. In 1994, Robinson implemented the Community Policing philosophy in establishing a police liaison office. From 1997-2004, he was assigned to both the police Special Operations Unity and Narcotics Unit. He served as a Task Force Agent with both U.S. Customs and the DEA. Commander Robinson was promoted to the rank of Sergeant in 2004, the rank of Lieutenant in 2009, and the rank of Commander in 2013. He is currently assigned as the Commander of the Patrol Division. Robinson was recognized by the Department of Homeland Security as a subject matter expert in the area of Community Policing and Countering Violent Extremism (CVE).
